Public Hospital District No. 1 Okanogan and Douglas Counties	
Proposition No. 1 One-Year Special Levy	
<p>The Commission of Public Hospital District No. 1, Okanogan and Douglas Counties, adopted Resolution No. 2022-05 concerning a proposition to finance and maintain the availability of essential health care services. If approved, this ballot proposition will provide funds to pay for the maintenance, development and expansion of the District's health care facilities and services by levying in 2022 for collection in 2023 a special one-year property tax in the amount of \$844,000, resulting in an estimated levy rate, in excess of the District's regular property tax levy, of 33 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value.</p>

<p>Chelan County Fire Protection District No. 1 and Douglas County Fire Protection District No. 2 have adopted a Joint Resolution approving the Wenatchee Valley Fire Department Plan ("Plan") concerning the creation of a Regional Fire Authority. This proposition would approve the Plan and create the Wenatchee Valley Fire Department, effective September 30, 2022 to provide fire protection and emergency medical services funded by a property tax not to exceed \$1.50 per thousand of assessed value to be levied in 2022.</p>
